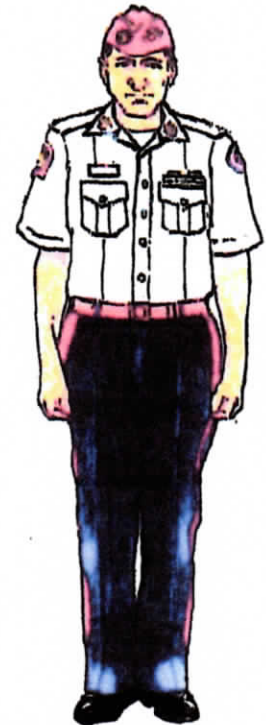

Subj: **PROPOSED ADDITION TO THE NATIONAL BY - LAWS / ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES  
ENCLOSURE - 3 CEREMONIAL UNIFORMS**

In accordance with National By - Laws, Article XI Section 1100 the following is submitted for consideration by the body assembled at National Convention.

## CEREMONIAL UNIFORMS currently reads

**NOTE** There is not a unique Ceremonial Uniform following action at the 2009 National Convention. Whenever Ceremonial functions are preformed, the Uniform will be the **UNDRESS UNIFORM** ( either Short Sleeve or Long Sleeve ) or the **CASUAL UNIFORM** as determined by the jurisdictional Commandant, and weather conditions.

## Change to add the following

### **CEREMONIAL UNIFORM FOR COLOR GUARDS ONLY**

Whenever Ceremonial functions are preformed, the Uniform will be the **UNDRESS UNIFORM** ( either Short Sleeve or Long Sleeve ) or the **Casual Uniform**. The Ceremonial Unit will wear **MCL RED Covers ONLY**. Unit members **will not** wear any MCL or DOD Ribbons, Badges, Pins, Name Tags or Collars of any kind. When wearing the Undress Uniform either short sleeve or long sleeve they will wear the Star burst emblems only. When wearing the Casual Uniform the Unit members will not wear any lapel pins or collars, And as before all members will be dressed the same, the jurisdictional Commandant or Unit Commander will determine the correct uniform in inclement weather.

## Rational

This will make the Ceremonial Uniform look clean and neat, and prevent any damage to the members ribbons and or badges caused by the Flag Holder Straps, We do not have to have all kind of things on our uniform to look sharp.
