Subj: Amendment of National Administrative Procedures

In accordance with the Reference, the below Amendment to the National Administrative Procedures is proposed.

Amend Chapter Seven, Section 7050, so that it reads:

Section 7050. Life Members: Regular or Associate Members of the Marine Corps League who are in Good Standing (as defined in the National Administrative Procedures, Section 7030 (GOOD STANDING)) may become a **LIFE MEMBER** upon proper payment of the **Dues**, as **are** required. A **LIFE MEMBER** shall be subject to the payment of **NO** further dues to that Detachment, Department, or National. Such member shall have all the privileges, rights, and benefits enjoyed as a member so long as that **LIFE MEMBER** shall live. Should a Marine Corps League Member choose to become a **LIFE MEMBER** in multiple Detachments, they must **first** become a Member in Good Standing by paying Annual Dues and then Life Membership Dues in each additional Detachment, if they so desire.

Modifications of the Life Membership Dues shall be recommended and published by the National Board of Trustees at least ninety (90) days before the Convention at which they to be considered and must be confirmed by the Delegates on the floor at the National Convention to be effective.


The rates for Life Membership will be posted in this Section of the National Administrative Procedures.

New wording is in bold italics and highlighted

Rationale: Historically, both Annual Membership Dues and Life Membership Dues have been the prerogative of the Delegates on the floor of the National Convention. We increased the Life Membership Dues in Mobile, so it can be done by the Delegates. We gave 50% of the new Life Membership Dues temporarily to the General Fund in Scottsdale, and then reluctantly we later made that permanent.

I reject the idea that the Delegates, including myself, are not able to effectively govern the League. Of course, that requires that all transactions are completely transparent.
