CURRENT BYLAW

IV SHOULDER PATCHES

Shoulder patches are worn on undress uniform white aviator shirt, short sleeve or long sleeve, and the female USMC style shirt only.

Article D. No service or Unit patches are to be worn on the Marine Corps League Uniform.

PROPOSED BYLAW AMENDMENT

Article D. Only Honor Guard Members are authorized to wear Honor Guard Patch and worn ONLY when performing Honor Guard Functions. The HG Patch to be worn on the LEFT sleeve, centered on the sleeve and 1-1/2" below shoulder sleeve. MCL Patch to be worn below, centered and just touching HG Patch.

RATIONAL JUSTIFICATION

For the countless hours of preparation needed to perform the many Marine Corps League Honor Guard functions and ceremonial functions, a HG Patch would give recognition and a sense of pride to the HG Member. To promote the many missions of the MCL, a well-motivated Honor Guard Uni is a must. A HG Patch worn ONLY by HG Members would instill a certain amount of pride in the select 'few.' Marines wear an EGA emblem signifying they earned the title Marine. A HG Member wearing an HG Patch would signify he or she has earned the title Marine Corps League Honor Guard Member.
