Subject: Proposed National Administrative Procedure Change

In accordance with the National Administrative Procedures, Chapter Ten, Section 10020, the following is submitted for consideration by the body assembled at the 2025 National Convention.

IRT: Administrative Procedures Section 7035.C Delinquent Member.

CURRENT

C. No delinquent member may be transferred.

PROPOSED

C. Delinquent member may be transferred, once a transfer form has been received from previous original detachment.

DISCUSSION

Members change locations for a variety of reasons, so when they check into a local detachment information is not always shared that they belong to another detachment at their last location and because the current paymaster may not have records indicating whether or not this individual is one of their old members.

So, the detachment paymaster does the transmittal as a renewal or new member, collects the application and dues and submits them up the chain for processing. MCL National Membership flags the individual in their system, that the Detachment Paymaster does not have access, to kick back the transmittal.

National has received the dues and transmittal, getting the Transfer Form can be secured from the losing detachment, but we (MCL) should not expect the member to submit additional dues to be

released. The losing detachment, if they collected the dues and submit the transmittal as it is currently designed can cause one of three scenarios.

1. National would have to reimburse the original dues back to the Detachment.
Or.
2. Give the member credit to upcoming year.
Or
3. Just request the submission of the Transfer form.

Recommend accepting the additional statement paragraph C.
