Home of Record City and State: (1) West Lafayette, IN Gunnery Sergeant is enthusiastically recommended for the Sergeant Harry D. Meyers Award for his outstanding contributions to the 3d Marine Littoral Regiment (MLR) and the 3d Marine Division's first deployment as part of the Littoral Rotational Force - Luzon (LRF-L) from 1 January 2024 to 31 December 2024. Gunnery served as the Staff Non-Commissioned Officer-In-Charge of Communications Company's first deployment to the Philippines, thereby directly enabling 3d MLR to project force in the first island chain in accordance with the imperatives of Force Design. Upon returning from LRF-L, Gunnery Sergeant selected to become the new Company Gunnery Sergeant and has since overseen all training and logistics requirements to prepare the company for continued success in future operations. Highlights of his accomplishments include: is the penultimate Staff Non-Commissioned Officer in 3d Marine Littoral a. Gunnery Sergeant Regiment. During the 2024 LRF-L deployment he served as both the Communications Chief and Networking Chief for 3d MLR's Alpha Command (A-CMD). His ability to implement and supervise all components of the Regimental Concept of Communications across multiple Military Occupational Specialties directly contributed to the Regiment's ability to conduct its mission essential tasks, integrate with both joint and coalition partners, and experiment with the newest technologies. Gunnery Sergeant was largely recognized as the "go-to" Staff Non-Commissioned Officer representing the communications field throughout the duration of the deployment, where both his leadership skills and technical acumen proved instrumental to mission success. b. As the Company Gunnery Sergeant for Communications Company, 3d MLR, Gunnery Sergeant excelled at ensuring Marines were trained and prepared for participation in current and future LRF-L deployments. Throughout the course of 2024 he successfully coordinated the training of over 150 Marines, including scheduling and overseeing 80 underwater egress certifications, two iterations of Tables 3-6, and two Company level Communications Exercises which involved the company's first aerial insertion and convoy utilizing solely organic assets - this resulted in the validation of the mission essential tasks solidifying the readiness of the company for the 2025 LRF-L deployment. Additionally, as the Company Gunnery Sergeant, Gunnery Sergeant organized and supervised the material readiness of Communications Company's armory and motor transportation assets, including 155 M4 rifles, PEQ-16s, PVS-14s and more than 40 pieces of rolling stock. During the Field Supply Maintenance Analysis Office's inspection of 3d MLR in December of 2024, Communications Company's armory cage received a perfect score on the FSMAO checklist. c. Gunnery Sergeant efforts as both a Networking Chief and the Company Gunnery Sergeant of Communications Company directly impacted the technical proficiency and operational effectiveness of the Marines in 3d MLR. In the performance of his duties, Gunnery Sergeant deliberately tailored the training plan for the networkers in Communications Company to ensure the Regimental Commander maintained multiple and a diverse means to execute command and control his forces within 3d MLR, close sensing and kill-chains, and integrate with the joint force and coalition nations. Where traditional infantry regiments employ two networking and his Marines regularly trained enclaves across one or two tactical networking kits, Gunnery Sergeant on and operated three enclaves across four tactical networking kits. Doing so required Communications Company personnel to develop a significantly deeper understanding of networking and information security tactics, techniques, and procedures than is commonplace anywhere else in the Fleet Marine Force, we were able to do so due to the tenacity for training and incremental plans developed by Gunnery Sergeant consistently demonstrated the technical acumen, indefatigable resolve, and d. Gunnery Sergeant unfaltering dedication to duty necessary to deliver mission accomplishment for Communications Company. His passion for basic Marine Corps values raised the standards for all Marines under his care, and his leadership directly resulted in the first successful deployment of 3d MLR to the first island chain. The accomplishments of he and his

Marines critically contributed to the development of the stand-in force model which will be leveraged by the entire Department of Defense to realize the United States's strategic objectives in the Indo-Pacific area of responsibility.

Gunnery Sergeant was born on 18 January 1988 in Dayton, Ohio. He enlisted in the Marine Corps on 1 November 2011. He attended recruit training at Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego, California. Upon graduation he reported to the School of Infantry, Marine Combat Training at Camp Pendleton, CA. After completion Gunnery Sergeant reported to NAS Pensacola, FL and completed the Aviation Structural Mechanic E course. Upon graduation he reported to Little Rock Air Force Base, AK and received the military occupational specialty of 6286, KC-130J Safety and Survival Equipment Mechanic.
In October of 2012, Gunnery Sergeant received orders to Marine Medium Tiltrotor Squadron 264, Marine Corps Air Station New River, NC where he served as a safety equipment mechanic. In January of 2013 Gunnery Sergeant deployed with VMM-264 in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. While deployed, Gunnery Sergeant deployed with VMM-264 in support of Corporal. Gunnery Sergeant deployed with VMM-264 in support of Special Purpose Marine Air Ground Task Force - Crisis Response Africa. In October of 2014, he detached with other members of VMM-264 to Monrovia, Liberia in support of Operation United Assistance. While deployed, Gunnery Sergeant was promoted to the rank of Sergeant and served NCOIC for the Aviation Life Support Systems Work Center.
In March of 2016, Gunnery Sergeant received orders to Marine Arial Refueling and Transport Squadron 252, Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, NC where he served as NCOIC of the Safety and Survival Equipment Work Center.
In November of 2016, Gunnery Sergeant attended the Cyber Network Specialist course at Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center Twentynine Palms, CA and received the military occupational specialty of 0631. In April of 2017, Gunnery Sergeant received orders to Headquarters and Headquarters Support Squadron, Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, NC, and served as a Network Technician.
Gunnery Sergeant was promoted to the rank of Staff Sergeant in April 2018, and received orders to Marine Wing Communications Squadron 28, Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, NC, where he served as the Networking Platoon Sergeant and Network Chief.
In April of 2019, Gunnery Sergeant received orders to Drill Instructor School, Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego, where he completed a three-year tour as a Drill Instructor, Marine Corps Instructor of Water Survival, and Senior Drill Instructor.
Upon completion of Drill Instructor duty, Gunnery Sergeant was promoted to the rank of Gunnery Sergeant and reported to Headquarters Battery, 1st Battalion, 12th Marine Regiment at Marine Corps Base Hawaii, where he served as the Battalion Network Chief and Headquarters Battery Gunnery Sergeant.

Gunnery Sergeant reported to Communications Company, 3D Marine Littoral Regiment in August of 2023, where he served as the Network Chief and SNCOIC of 2nd Platoon and deployed to The Philippines in support of multiple joint and multi-lateral exercises. Upon return, Gunnery Sergeant was assigned and is currently serving as the Company Gunnery Sergeant for Communications Company.

His personal awards include the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal with two gold stars in lieu of 3d award and the Marine Corps Good Conduct Medal with 3 bronze stars in lieu of 4th award.
